

SOUTHWARK CATHEDRAL BACH RECITAL 1

The concert today is a recreation of a programme of Bach's organ works which Felix Mendelssohn performed in the Thomaskirche in Leipzig in 1840. The 1840 performance was attended by Robert Schumann, who wrote glowingly about the music and the occasion, which was arranged so that the Thomaskirche could raise funds for its now famous Bach memorial statue. This programme was performed by John Scott in St Thomas's Church, 5th Avenue, New York City last year and the performance today is dedicated to him.
